• Reserve Funds – Committee Chair, Angela Gerke, Eric Sauder

- o Good evening, everyone. On behalf of the Reserve Fund Committee, I'd like to share a brief update on our work over the past months.
- After meeting and reviewing the teacher survey results, we grouped their requests into two main categories.
 - The first category is "Wants" practical, functional classroom support items. These are things like basic supplies, new books and games, sensory materials, nesting stools, and classroom snacks.
 - The second category is "Needs" items that support staff appreciation, morale, and overall well-being. These include gift cards, take-home meals, flowers, massages, and spirit wear.
 - We've discussed these with the PTO, and many of these smaller items can be supported right away. Together, we'll be developing a quarterly rotation plan to help meet teacher needs more consistently. The estimated cost to begin this plan is about \$1,500, which uses only a small portion of our reserve funds.
- o Looking ahead, after keeping a \$25,000 emergency balance in the reserve account, we will have approximately \$30,000 available for long-term, highimpact initiatives. The Reserve Fund Committee, the PTO Board, and our teachers and staff are working together to identify the best investments that will benefit the school long term.
 - Right now, our focus is on two major areas: technology upgrades and air quality improvements, including air purifiers and air conditioning units. These priorities were consistently highlighted as needs that would make a significant difference in our classrooms and learning environment.
- o We'll continue to collaborate, gather input, and bring forward clear recommendations in the coming months and are looking for any person or experts to help in these areas. If any parents own businesses that are willing to give their time and talents to helping in these two specific areas, we would greatly appreciate the expertise.
