Powers Catholic Bowling Coach, Mr. Matthew Wheeler, would like to promote the Middle school bowling season. He is trying to build a sustained program at Powers Catholic and needs to have students start bowling before their freshman year. Here are a few points Coach Wheeler wants to share with our parents and students in Grades 6-8:
