BOARD REPORTS

President's Report: (Cindy Jones)

Explanation of agenda and how to chat on Zoom.

<u>UM/MSU Canned Food Drive:</u> At the end of October, PTO held our service project benefitting our parish outreach center. We asked our school families to donate a canned food item and the students were able to place their food item into shopping carts located at all entrances decorated for Michigan or Michigan State. Each day we counted the items for each team and those totals were announced daily. At the end of the week, the grand totals were revealed to the kids. For the second year in a row, Michigan State won 860 - 741. Ultimately though, our outreach won with over 1600 food items donated! Thank you to all that donated and encouraged this friendly rivalry!

<u>Trunk or Treat:</u> We were unable to host our Fall festival this year, so we came up with a great school-wide event that was held during the school day. We asked families to decorate their trunks or donate candy to the event. All students were able to parade around the St. Joseph parking lot in their costumes. We had 40 cars participate. There was a contest for the best decorated trunk voted by the students. The top 3 cars were the Frye family, the Cooper family, and the Mannor family.

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<u>Teacher Luncheon/Room Service Treats:</u> Our hospitality committee provided dinner for the teachers on the Tuesday night during conference week from Italia Gardens. Additionally, the PTO board put together a "room service" snack for each teacher that week. The teachers were able to order a snack and drink and then delivered to their classrooms.

<u>Scrip</u>: There are a lot of new families that have signed up for Scrip gift cards this year. The list of all retailers participating in this program can be found on our school website under the heading "Support HFS". There you will find the sign up forms to designate where you would like your rebates to go to and the list of all retailers.

You can put your orders in for physical cards online and they will be sent home with your child. If you don't want to link your checking account/credit card, you can send a check in with your child. Linking a checking account has a \$.15 fee per order and credit card payments have a \$2.25 fee per order.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> (Heather Richert)

<u>2020/2021 PTO Financial Overview:</u> Not a lot of change since the last update. We've had some deposits...mostly fundraising income. Shoparoo ended this summer, but we just got our check from last year, \$371. Today, we received two Dine to Donate checks from Aubree's. One from October and the other one is from last year totaling \$424.41. Another check came in from School Supply, \$715. And the biggest surprise was used uniforms (\$660) compared to previous years. We haven't had a lot of expenses so far, the supplies for the trunk or treat were donated.

<u>Santa's Workshop:</u> This year we will be providing 2 options for shopping at Santa's Workshop. ELearners can shop online (however, no money comes back to HFS this way) and students going in-person can shop like past years. The workshop is December 7th - 11th. For the in person shopping, we cannot have our usual volunteers in the school this year, this will be run by staff/teachers only. We will provide pictures, descriptions and prices of every item for sale and ask parents to let your child "shop" from the photos so when it's their day to shop, they know exactly what they will be buying. Checks will also be the only method of payment allowed.

Diane Mischel brought forth an idea of letting eLearners turn in the order form and pick up their gifts at an arranged time. This way that money comes back to HFS.

<u>Community Service Project:</u> As stated at our last Zoom meeting, we will be doing a community service project every other month. Since hospital patients cannot receive visitors this holiday season, we thought it would be nice to have the students make Christmas cards for them. Box Tops: (*Melissa Mannor*) - We need ALL of our school families to download the Box Tops for Education app on their phones. Exact numbers to date: we've only earned \$218 since July and in order to meet our yearly goal, we need to earn \$500 by the end of November.
