On Thursday and Friday this week while our students had the days off, our teachers and staff had some time to work on curriculum development and faith formation. One high interest topic discussed is the mastery of math facts and we would like to ask for your help. In order for our school to continue to introduce higher level, more complex thinking and problem solving in math, our students should master the addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts (0-12) by the end of the Fourth Grade. We begin by introducing addition and subtraction facts in Kindergarten, aiming to have mastery of addition and subtraction facts (0-10) in First Grade, (0-12) in Second Grade. In Third Grade, students should have the multiplication facts (0-12) mastered, and by Fourth Grade have the division facts (0-12) mastered. These facts are sung, chanted and recited in class, while in line, playing games and more. We would like to ask that our students continue to practice these facts 5-10 minutes each day. Car rides to and from school are a great place to practice! Thank you so much for your partnership!

On Friday, our teachers and staff shared a common experience across the Diocese of Lansing. We participated in "Theology of the Body", a program allowing us to work on our individual faith formation and for inspiration. This program is based on the teachings/writings of Pope John Paul II. Through this formation, we have an opportunity to dive back into who we are and find out what God has intended for us. United, we are stronger and better together.
